Route 263 Project Update

The long awaited Route 263 (York Road) reconstruction project is now anticipated to be bid out in the fall of 2012, with a project start date of Spring 2013. The reason for the delays is funding. This project is anticipated to be in the 37 million dollar range. Today, there is 23 million allocated in TIP (transportation improvement funding). Many of you have contacted us, as well as your state elected officials on this matter. More funding is needed with the next round of TIP. State Mandated Stormwater and Grading Ordinance Adopted

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has mandated that all Townships in the Neshaminy Watershed adopt and enforce a Stormwater Management and Grading Ordinance. The Board of Supervisors is not in agreement with the mandated approach and has done its best to change and customize, **WHERE** permitted, to lessen the impact to small residential projects.

“How will it effect you?” The answer varies from project to project. Projects which add less than 1,000 square feet of impervious coverage will not require a stormwater permit, but will require the property owner’s acknowledgement that the regulations found in the ordinance will be met. This might include things like additional plantings, rain gardens, and french drains. Applicants will receive literature on what their responsibility is for their project.

Projects which add more than 1,000 but less than 5,000 square feet will be required to submit a stormwater management plan to the Township. We will provide residents and contractors with a brochure of suggested best management practices. Possible stormwater management facilities include but are not limited to an infiltration trench, tree plantings, rain barrel and/or rain garden. The plan is not required to be prepared by a licensed engineer if the applicant is able to provide the required information. However, it still must address the regulations of the ordinance. The Township will forward a copy of your plan to the Township Engineer’s office for review. They may contact you with any questions regarding the plan. Common projects which fall into this category are in-ground pools, new home construction, large additions, garages, pole barns, and driveways. These projects will require an additional fee for reviews and a stormwater permit.

Projects larger than 5,000 square feet will be required to submit a stormwater management plan to the Township; however, this plan will have to be prepared by a licensed engineer. Generally, plans in excess of 5,000 square feet will require land development approval as well. These will require a separate stormwater permit and related fees.

The stormwater management plan does not replace any previously required building or zoning permits. A reminder that doing work without permits may result in additional fees. The new ordinance, along with all ordinances can be found on the website www.warwick-bucks.org. Click on codes and use key word search to find your area of interest.

New Flood Insurance Maps

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is in the process of updating their Federal Insurance Rates Map (FIRM). FEMA has been engaged in a multiyear project to assess Warwick Township's floodplains and either augment or diminish them accordingly.

Warwick Township has sent out notification to property owners affected by a change in the floodplain. In other words, if you were in the floodplain and still are, you did not receive notification and vice versa. However, if you were not in the floodplain but now are, then should have received notification and vice versa.

For those that have been moved into the floodplain: if you have a mortgage from a federally regulated lender, your lender may require you to carry flood insurance when these flood maps become effective. Flood insurance is available through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP); a federally underwritten program provided by nearly 100 insurance companies and written through licensed insurance agents. In the upcoming months, you may be contacted by your mortgage company informing you that you will need to acquire flood insurance. If you do not take out the coverage yourself, your mortgage company will choose coverage for you and add the premium to your monthly mortgage payment (Be advised they will not be as concerned with price and coverage as you would be).

If you do not have a mortgage, it is still recommended that you purchase flood insurance. Over the life of a 30-year loan, your home is three times more likely to have a flood than a fire. Additionally, most homeowners insurance policies do not provide coverage for damage due to flooding. For more information on flood insurance, please visit the National Flood Insurance Program's website, www.floodsmart.gov.

The new floodplain will not be in effect until sometime in 2012, but if you acquire flood insurance before the effective date, you can be eligible to receive a "grandfathered" rate. Once the appeals and protests are reviewed and once any needed map changes are incorporated, FEMA will issue a Letter of Final Determination. Six months later, an ordinance approving the new Digital Flood Insurance Rate Map will be adopted. The maps will then become effective, as will any new flood insurance requirements. However, please be aware that starting immediately these flood hazard maps will be used in helping to determine requirements for construction and development.

The maps that were just released are still known as preliminary maps. Bucks County is currently in the Public Comment Period.

This period will end towards the end of September. This is a time when citizens will have the opportunity to submit technical and/or scientific data to file a protest regarding their individual property, or an appeal regarding the accuracy of the mapping process in general. To learn more about protests and appeals, visit http://www.rampp-team.com/fact_region3.htm. The most common application for a property owner to file an appeal is the Letter of Map Amendment (LOMA). On the website above, the LOMA form can be found under the hyperlink "MT-EZ." If you need help completing the LOMA form, do not hesitate to contact FEMA at 1-800-FEMA-MAP. FEMA has floodplain specialists on call ready to assist any residents with concerns and questions. You can inspect the floodplain maps yourself during normal business hours at the Warwick Township Municipal Building.

Curbs and Sidewalks Ordinance

The Warwick Township Board of Supervisors strives to ensure the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Warwick Township. In doing so, Second Class Township Code, delegates to the Township general authority and supervision for maintaining all curbs and sidewalks within the Township. With this in mind, the Board of Supervisors has determined that it is necessary to adopt an ordinance to assist in maintaining all township sidewalks and curbs.

Sidewalk Requirements: The Township requires all property owners abutting any street, including state highways, to repair the sidewalk along their property if damaged or declared unsafe by the Township.

Curb Requirements: The Township requires all property owners abutting state highways and owners of any non residential properties to repair curbs that are damaged or declared unsafe

Notice to repair sidewalks and/or curbs will be given by registered or certified mail to the abutting property owner when recognized as such by Township inspection. The property owner will have 30 days to comply with the notice and any specifications prescribed. Failure to comply will give the Township the authority to complete the necessary repairs at the cost of the property owner.

Medication Drop Box

The Warwick Township Police Department will now have a permanent medication drop box available in the police department lobby. Residents may use the box to dispose of their old medications – no questions will be asked. Recognizing a need to keep medications from falling into the wrong hands, Warwick Township, The Bucks County District Attorney's Office, and the Bucks County Drug and Alcohol Commission have provided the funding for the drop box. The police department lobby is open every business day from 8am to 4:30pm. For questions, or to schedule an after-hours disposal of medication, please contact Corporal Aaron Richwine, 215-343-6102, ext. 411. The box is expected to be installed sometime in the summer of 2011. The Police Department will announce when it is available on the Township web site, www.warwick-bucks.org.
