Permits Needed For Home Improvement

Planning to start a home improvement project this spring or summer? Here is what you need to know to insure you have all the appropriate permits! At times residents become so engrossed in their home improvement projects they may overlook the idea of obtaining proper permits. Furthermore, determining which projects require necessary permits can often times be confusing. Hopefully, by reading our Frequently Asked Permit Questions, you will be more prepared for the up and coming project season.

FREQUENTLY ASKED PERMIT QUESTIONS:

Q: When are permits required?

A: An owner or authorized agent who intends to construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, demolish or change the occupancy of a residential building or erect, install, enlarge, alter, repair, remove, convert or replace any electrical, gas, mechanical, or plumbing system must first apply to the building code official, located at the Warwick Township Administration Building, and obtain the required permits. Please note that this procedure is regulated by the Uniform Construction Code and is under 403.62a of PA. Act 45, Title XXXIV Enforcement Regulations.

Q: More specifically which projects require a building permit?

A: 1.) All structural interior and exterior changes (i.e., additions, basement finishes, sheds, decks, fences, chimneys, pools, roof dormers, window enlargements, concrete patios, garage conversions to living space, wood stoves, gas fireplaces, paver brick or slate patios set in sand).

2.) Re-roofing existing roofs.

3.) Alterations to the electrical system (this includes upgrading your service panel)

4.) Alterations to the plumbing system (Please note this is not a comprehensive list, rather it is merely a guide. Please call the Township 215-343-6100 if you are unsure about a project type not listed.)

Q: Which projects do NOT require a building permit?

A: 1.) Exterior siding and/or window door, garage door, storm window and storm door replacement when items are replaced in kind.

2.) Exterior or interior painting, papering, tiling, carpeting, flooring, cabinets, countertops and similar finish work.

3.) Retaining walls that are not more than four feet high.

4.) Swings and other playground equipment for one and two family dwellings.

5.) Window awnings supported by an exterior wall which do not project more than 54 inches from the exterior wall and do not require additional support.

6.) Replacement of any roofing material that does not exceed 25% of the total roof area performed within a 12-month period.

7.) Repair or replacement of any part of a porch or stoop which does not structurally support a roof located above the porch or stoop.

8.) Installation of additional roll or batt insulation.

9.) Replacement of exterior gutters or leaders.

10.) Installation or rearrangement of communications wiring.

11.) Replacement of kitchen or bathroom appliances or fixtures (If the appliances or fixtures are not being moved to a different location).

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New Animal Waste Ordinance

As part of Ordinance 2010-02 that was passed in February 2010, there is reference made to disposal and removal of animal fecal matter that states "No owner of any animal or any person having the care, custody and control of any animal shall permit the same to discharge or deposit any fecal matter upon the property of another without immediately removing such matter and disposing of it in a sanitary manner. The term "property of another" shall include the property of the Township or of any other political subdivision. No owner or possessor of real property shall permit animal fecal matter to accumulate on such property for more than 24 hours, and it shall be the owner's or possessor's responsibility to daily remove such matter to prevent any such accumulation from becoming a danger to public health."

Violations and penalties: Except as may be otherwise provided in 3 P.S., § 459-101 et seq., any person who shall violate any of the provisions shall, upon summary conviction before a District Judge, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1000), plus the charges for the maintenance of said animal and the costs of prosecution. In default of the payment of said fine, charges or costs, said person shall be sentence to undergo imprisonment in the Bucks County Prison for a period not exceeding 30 days. Each day that a violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense. All fines collected for the violation of this chapter shall be to and for the use of the township. If, deemed appropriate by the enforcement official, a warning may be issued prior to issuance of a summary citation.

Please pickup after your pets at home and in the township parks.
